At KES:

Coming from a large family and his father having recently died, Albert arrived at KES in 1908. He was described as very good as a House monitor and Tailor. With such a good report he left in 1913 to be a tailor to the Queen's Regiment.

Date of Death: 27th September 1917

Place: Belgium

Buried: Hooge Crater Cemetery, West-Vlaanderen

Albert was just 19 when he died during one of the phases of the Third Battle of Ypres - either the Battle of Menin Road or the Battle of Polygon Wood.
