Trumpeter. 36th Brigade, Royal Field Artillery

At KES:

Clarence came to KES in 1909 from his home in Lewisham. He was described as "good in Band, Drum" When he left in 1912 he went straight into the military.

Date of Death: 11th November 1918

Place: France

Buried: Abbeville Communal Cemetery

Clarence died of wounds – being gassed at No.2 Stationary Hospital. The circumstances of the gassing are unknown.

...died on November 11th at No 2 Stationary Hospital, France from being "gassed". He had served as a Trumpeter in the R.F.A for about two years. When at School Dupre was very popular both with the boys and Staff in spite of his frequent antics. His contemporaries will remember him as one of the "Panic" Stars of coronation year.
