Frank came to KES in 1899 from his home in Docklands. His occupation was in the House and he was described as very good. He left in 1904 but no details are given as to where he went. However when he joined up he was a chocolate moulder at Bourneville.

He married Alice in 1915.

Date of Death: 27th May 1918

Place: France

Remembered on the Soissons Memorial, Aisne

Frank was killed in action and has no known grave. The Soissons Memorial commemorates almost 4,000 officers and men of U K forces who were killed during the battles of Aisne and the Marne in 1918. Frank's regiment was engaged in the Battle of Aisne 27th May – 6th June and it was probable that he was killed then.
