At KES:

George was one of 8 children whose father was a farmer in Lincolnshire. After his death in 1890 George came to KES in 1891. His occupation was "Garden" and he was good. He also became a 2 stripe monitor, so was highly regarded. However there is a comment in the records that says he was "very lazy"! When he left in 1894 he became a clerk, first with Great Northern Railway and later in a bank.

Date of Death: 2nd October 1918

Place: England

Buried: Barnes Old Cemetery

Died in Royal Herbert Hospital, Woolwich. He was buried in Old Barnes Cemetery because his home was in Barnes, where he lived with his wife and three children.

The circumstances of his death are unknown.

...died on October 2nd at the Royal Herbert Hospital, Woolwich, of pneumonia after being badly gassed. Budibent was a fine lad at School and at the time he left was senior monitor. He joined the staff of the London County & Westminster Bank on leaving School, and the last we heard of him he was at Melksham. In the army he quickly gained promotion and rose to the rank of major in the A.S.C.H.

His brother Cecil – also a K.E.S. Old Boy – was killed earlier in the war. To his sorrowing widow and other relatives we tender our deepest sympathy.
