**Stoker 1<sup>st</sup> Class. HMS LION, Royal Navy**

### **At KES:**

George came from Wandsworth in South London. After his father died he came to KES in 1905. He was a good Boot Maker and when he left in 1908 he was a clerk in the Department Store of Marshall & Snelgrove. By 1911 he was working in a flour mill in Wandsworth.

**Date of Death: 7<sup>th</sup> June 1916**

**Place: Scotland**

**Buried: Dalmeny and Queensferry Cemetery**

HMS Lion was involved in the Battle of Jutland and was hit 14 times with 99 crew members killed and 51 wounded. On June 2<sup>nd</sup> Lion reached Rosyth for repairs. George died from wounds and was buried in Scotland.
