Harry had no father and came to KES in 1895. Although his occupation was in the Band, he was not well behaved. When he left in 1898 he became a telephone wireman. He married in 1905 and had a daughter and two sons.

Harry had enlisted but had been discharged from active service. He was formally part of 129 London Regiment, 646th Field Company, Royal Engineers.
