### **At KES:**

Percy was born in Holborn, London and when his father died in 1902 he came to KES. He was described as very good in the Carpenter's Shop and so when he left in 1906 he went straight into a situation as a cabinet maker.

**Date of Death: 15<sup>th</sup> August 1917**

**Place: Belgium**

**Remembered on the Menin Gate Memorial, Ypres**

Percy was killed in action and has no known grave. He was killed during preparations for the Battle of Langemarck (16<sup>th</sup>-18<sup>th</sup> August), part of the Third Battle of Ypres.
