At KES:

Percy was an orphan and came to KES in 1894. He was very fair in the Band. When he left in 1898 he became a clerk. Apparently, he was rejected by the army because of poor eyesight. His love of music stayed with him and in 1901 he volunteered as a bandsman in the 21st Middlesex Regiment.

Percy married in 1905 and had 3 children.

Date of Death: 3rd January 1918

Place: England

Buried: Islington

Percy died from Tuberculosis. He enlisted again in 1914 but was discharged as unfit in 1917.

...died at his home on January $3^{\rm rd}$ 1918. A volunteer from 1901. Peacock mobilised for Active Service in 1914 and served for 3 years with a clear medical record, but in June 1917 he collapsed and was finally discharged on July $10^{\rm th}$ of that year.

When at School Peacock was in the Band. He left to enter the Accountants' Department of Marshall & Snelgrove in Vere Street, where he remained for several years. He leaves a widow and family to whom we extend our deepest sympathy in their loss.
