At KES:

Sidney's father had died when he was 9 years old. He came to KES in 1900 from his home in Paddington. His occupation was Band and he was good. When he left in 1904 he went to work for the G.P.O. and was there till he enlisted.

Date of Death: 8th September 1918

Place: England

Buried: Paddington Old Cemetery, Kilburn

Sidney died in hospital in Lincoln from wounds received in a gas attack in France. He joined in 1916 and went to France in 1917. His Army Service Record suggests that he was gassed sometime in August 1918.
