Overall Purpose

Main duties and Key Responsibilities

- Teach Piano to pupils on a 1-1 and in groups from beginners to more advanced pupils.
- Be an excellent and enthusiastic role model who wants to inspire and pass on their musical skills and expertise to young people.
- Be prepared to accompany groups to concerts and other events including those that fall on weekends.
- Be able to work effectively within a team in the music department, assisting as required and giving and taking advice as necessary.
- Assist with music department administration (libraries and practice rotas).
- Be able to record and analyse musical achievements using IT in an effective and organised manner.
- Join in the life of a busy, vibrant school in areas as requested by the Director of Music/as directed by the Head.

The Department

Music is studied in the curriculum by all pupils throughout the school. Music lessons are popular, both aural and theory, and are delivered to both groups and individuals.

Peripatetic teachers are given individual timetables in accordance with the school regulations and allocated teaching room/s. They will be aware of when and where practice facilities are available and are expected to keep in touch with department and school matters in general. The work and progress of pupils is also reported on a regular basis by the teacher.
