'The school feels *contemporary and uncrowded*, with preserved historical charms like the *magnificent chapel* and the old quad, where a *statue of the young King Edward* stands peacefully'.

Being five minutes' walk from the station (London-Guildford-Portsmouth line) makes rail *a good choice for transport.*



'It's incredible what Mrs Wright has done for the place.' Her character, they tell us, is one of *'quiet, calm assertiveness,'* but also *'...a force to be reckoned with.'* One parent told us, *'She's probably one of the kindest people I've met in years.'*



'In Queen Mary House (years 7 and 8) common *rooms look comfortable and homely.* Thoughtfully designed bedrooms give everyone *a sense of their own space.* Older pupils say houses are 'not just where you register and hang out... *they're an important part of identity'.*

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FINALS GALORE FOR KING EDWARD'S SPORTS TEAMS

Our sports' teams have enjoyed have enjoyed unprecedented success this year, reaching four national finals. The girls and boys involved have represented our School with great honour, and we congratulate them on their brilliant achievements.

Our boys' **Under 15 football team** greatly enjoyed their 'day in the sun' at **The Hawthorns**, Championship club West Bromwich Albion's ground, in the **English Schools Football Association Cup Final**. Cheered on by almost 200 pupils and staff from King Edward's, the boys were very close to taking home the trophy, only to be pipped 2-1 by worthy winners, St Patrick's College. The team featured a mix of pupils who had played together since 1st Form and those, from the UK and around the world, who had joined the School more recently and we look forward to going one better and bringing the cup home in next season's tournament.





Alongside our more established sports, King Edward's has recently introduced opportunities to play padel competitively and recreationally for all of our pupils; this has proved to be a hugely popular addition to our wide-ranging sports programme. Our top **Under 15 padel players** journeyed to Rocket Padel and both our girls' and boys' teams reached the finals in their competitions, narrowly losing out to more established school teams. We plan to further expand our padel programme next year, with the appointment of a **new Head of Rackets** at our School.

The girls' **Under 14 netball team** earned the highest honour of becoming **national champions**, following a Final Four event held at Loughborough University, home court of national league Loughborough Lightning. Following an extensive series of play off victories, our girls earned their place at 'Manic Monday' and after a tough semi-final v Merchant Taylor's, were **victorious in their final** against St John's. This championship victory was the highlight of a very successful season across the School, led by our new Head of Netball Mrs Lovesey, and we look forward to further successes in the years to come.





MAGICAL MUSIC MOMENTS ACROSS KING EDWARD'S

Our 2024/25 musical programme has continued to enthral our School community, and our many visitors, with many events taking place throughout the School year. Each week over 150 1:1 music lessons are offered at King Edward's, together with choirs, ensembles and bands, and pupils enjoying their music at all levels have regular opportunities to perform in our event spaces.

The King Edward's *Musician of The Year* competition is a true annual highlight at our School, with a week of preliminary rounds leading to a Finals Day, featuring pupils of all ages competing in a wide range of classes and genres. Over 20% of our pupils competed in the event this year, with the finals taking 6 hours to complete! After so many virtuoso performances, Edward, with his mesmerising piano performance was awarded the coveted trophy for 2025.

We celebrated our focus on organ performances in May with a performance of Hans Zimmer's score of Christopher Nolan's blockbusting film Interstellar by international star Roger Sayer in our Chapel. Many organ and Interstellar enthusiasts travelled from far and wide for this inspirational evening, with our guest also conducting a lengthy Q+A with the audience. The event continued our long tradition of organ excellence, with our pupils regularly transitioning to music colleges on organ scholarships, and provided an inspiration to those pupils aiming to follow in our Old Witleians footsteps.





Our programme of accessible, smaller scale recitals and *open mic* nights has continued throughout our School year, and we took advantage of the excellent May weather to host our latest open mic event outside in our Music School courtyard. Pupils and staff from throughout the School took the opportunity to perform informally to their peers in a *relaxed environment*, providing for many the first opportunity to showcase their developing talents as they learn their instruments here at King Edward's. We look forward to many of our open mic performers taking to our bigger stages during their time at our School.

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NEW PREFECTS FOR THE 2025/26 ACADEMIC YEAR

Each year at King Edward's, our spring term sees a 'changing of the guard' in our pupil leadership teams, as our Upper 6th Prefects bid farewell to focus on their upcoming A levels and BTEC examinations, and our **new Prefect team** take the stage for their year in the spotlight.

Our 2025/26 Prefects were selected after a rigorous process, including input from their predecessors, peers and staff members, and were announced to great excitement at a whole School assembly. Our Prefects then enjoyed *a reception with our Head, Mrs Wright*, and senior staff and received some words of advice from our 2024/25 Prefects. This year's team includes boarding and day pupils, from many countries around the world and from the UK.



At the end of term, our current Head Girl and Head Boy, Emily and Barry, formally stepped down for their roles and their successors Abi and Peter were welcomed to their positions by the whole School community before traditional photos were taken in our courtyard. Abi and Peter were delighted by their appointments, noting that 'The School provides so many opportunities for pupils to gain leadership skills, and we are honoured to be given the chance to lead the Prefect team this year'.
